NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF REMAINING APPLICATION STAGE INTERVENOR  
FUNDS AND SCHEDULE FOR SUBMITTING FUNDING REQUESTS

(Issued October 15, 2018)

On November 29, 2017, Baron Winds LLC (Baron), a subsidiary of Innogy Renewables US LLC, filed with the New York State Board on Electric Generation Siting and the Environment (Siting Board) an application for a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need, pursuant to Article 10 of the Public Service Law. Baron proposes to construct a commercial-scale wind power project (the Project) in the Towns of Cohocton, Dansville, Fremont and Wayland in Steuben County, New York. The Project would have a nameplate capacity of 242 megawatts and would include up to 69 wind turbines, underground and overhead collection lines, access roads, meteorological towers, an operation and maintenance building, and a collection substation to deliver power to the New York State power grid. Baron proposes to construct the collection substation adjacent to an existing substation, which will interconnect with the New York State Electric and Gas 230 kilovolt transmission line in Cohocton.

**PLEASE TAKE NOTICE** that, following the award of intervenor funds in the total amount of \$306,600 to the Towns of Fremont, Wayland, Cohocton and Dansville, intervenor funds in the amount of \$69,279.52 remain available for award to eligible municipal and local parties for use in contributing to a

complete record leading to an informed decision by the Siting Board as to the appropriateness of the site and facility. Such funds are available to defray expenses for expert witnesses, consultants, administrative fees and/or legal fees (other than in connection with judicial review).
